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COLLEGE PROFILE

Freedom Fighter Pandit Susheel Rattan Government Degree College Jawalamukhi, District Kangra, Himachal Pradesh, is a premier institution of higher education catering to the educational aspirations of students belonging to Jawalamukhi and the adjoining rural and semi-rural areas. Situated along NH-303, the college lies approximately two kilometres from the historic temple town of Jawalamukhi and enjoys a serene natural environment with the majestic Dhauladhar ranges forming a picturesque backdrop. Spread across more than 42 kanal of land, the campus provides a peaceful and conducive atmosphere for academic, cultural, and co-curricular activities.

The institution was originally established on 1st July 1999 as a privately managed college under the name Jawalaji Degree College and functioned under the aegis of the Jawalaji Shiksha Samiti. Subsequently, the college was taken over by the Government of Himachal Pradesh, Department of Higher Education, on 8th June 2016. Up to 11th March 2025, it was known as Government College Jawalaji; thereafter, on 12th March 2025, the institution was renamed as Freedom Fighter Pandit Susheel Rattan Government Degree College Jawalamukhi.

Recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act and affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, the college has emerged as a significant centre of higher learning in this region of District Kangra. In recognition of its academic growth and future potential, the Government of Himachal Pradesh declared the institution an Institute of Excellence vide letter No. EDUC-B015/11/2023-EDU-C-Part-I dated 14th March 2025.

The college offers undergraduate programmes in Humanities, Sciences, Commerce, BBA, and BCA, along with postgraduate programmes including M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., and PGDCA. The BCA programme under self-financing mode was introduced in the academic session 2018–19, whereas BBA and PGDCA programmes commenced from the session 2019–20.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITION (FOR BBA & BCA)

Plus two Examinations with any stream under 10+2 system or other examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with at least 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST Candidates).

Or

Any examination of a Board/University/College/School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent Committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi.

AGE LIMIT

A student who has attained the age of 23 years for boys & 25 years for girls on 1st July, 2026 (Upper age limit is raised to 26 years for ST/SC candidates). The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum period of 6 months.

BASIS OF ADMISSION

Subsidized Seats:

Admission shall be made on the basis of merit list determined on the basis of marks obtained in Matriculation and +2 examinations. A candidate with Commerce or Mathematics at +2 levels will be given additional 10% of the percentage marks obtained in +2, while computing merit for Admission. 75% of seats shall be reserved for those who have passed their qualifying examinations from H.P. Board of School Education/H.P. University.

Non-Subsidized Seats:

Non-Subsidized Seats will be filled on the basis of First Come First Served once the subsidized seats are completely filled'

To Resolve a Tie

1. In case of tie, the candidate having higher aggregate marks in the qualifying examination shall be admitted first.
2. If the tie is still not resolved the candidate younger in age will be admitted first.

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

1. Admission will be made on the recommendation of admission committee.
2. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
3. All admission will be provisional subject to the approval of V.C., HPU Shimla.
4. All terms and conditions of the admission and fee structure can be changed or modified as per the directions of HPU Shimla.
5. A candidate seeking admission will be accompanied by his/her parents/guardian at the time of admission-cum-counseling.
6. A student must produce original certificates at the time of counseling.
7. A candidate having a gap of one or more years in the studies will have to submit an affidavit explaining the reasons.
8. Every student seeking admission in any class will be required to pay Rs. 500/- to PTA Fund. Fees and funds once deposited will not be refunded.
9. Girl's students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafied certificate for fee connection in Tuition Fee.
10. Students seeking exemption from the Tuition Fee for disability must attach an attested copy of at least 40% disability certificate.
11. Candidates coming from school of Education Board/University other than H.P. Board of School Education/ HPU Shimla must produce migration certificates in original. Only students who have passed in all subjects in 10+2 from NOS (with English) shall be admitted to BCA / BBA subject to the minimum eligibility conditions.
12. Minimum pass percentage for admission in different faculties is given as:

As per the direction of Hon'ble high court any candidate with compartment in +2 will not be eligible for seeking admission in any of the undergraduate courses	

PROCEDURE FOR ONLINE ADMISSION FOR THE SESSION 2026-2027

Candidates/Parents/Guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and check the college website <https://gcjawalaji.edu.in> from time to time as the admission process will be online and submit the application form after completing in all respects through an online mode only. Kindly refer to the following link for the admission: <http://admission.gcjawalaji.edu.in>

1. Open Registration Section
2. On the homepage, click on the “Registration 2026–27” option. After that, click on “New UG Registration”.
3. Select “Professional Courses” to apply for professional courses such as BCA, BBA.
4. After selecting the course category, the Student Registration Form will open.
5. Fill in all the required personal details carefully, such as: Name, Date of Birth (DOB), Aadhaar Card Number, Gender, Email ID, Mobile Number, Admission Type etc. The application form is to be filled up by the applicant through his /her own ID, carefully after reading all rules and eligibility conditions.
6. Make sure all the information entered is correct.
7. After filling all the details, click on the “Submit Registration” button.
8. Once the registration is completed successfully, a User ID and Password will be generated.
9. Candidate must save the “Username and Password” generated during registration process and complete the admission process by filling the online application form using their own username and password from “Login to Apply” button.
10. Candidate needs to fill the online admission form using his/her own credentials, after that only his/her candidature will be considered for admission.
11. Registration alone does not make any candidate eligible for admission. At the time of registration, Rs. 200/- will be charged for college admission registration on college online admission portal (for 1st-year students only). After registration, the students have to submit duly filled online application form with all required documents.
12. Certificates are to be attached in a sequence as prescribed in application form.
13. Photostat copies of documents are not accepted. If admission committee finds any uploaded Photostat copy at the time of form verification, then the admission form will be rejected, and the candidate will have to rectify the rejected form from his / her account, and resubmit it within stipulated time.
14. At the time of form verification, the admission committee holds all the rights to reject any

of the uploaded documents, if documents are not uploaded in the prescribed format mentioned in the instructions provided then the student will be communicated by the committee through “SMS and E-mail” on their registered mobile number and email address to do the needful changes.

15. Candidate then needs to make the corrections by logging in his/her account using his/her username and password and resubmit the form and wait for the final approval which will be intimated through SMS and Email.
16. After the final approval from the admission committees, the date will be informed by the respective admission committees through SMS and Email on their registered mobile number. A link for the payment will be sent on the registered e-mail and mobile number through a SMS.
17. Candidate needs to pay the fee online to complete the admission process by logging into the account using his/her own username and password.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

The completed admission form along with the bio data card, undertaking and PTA form must be submitted along with the following documents:

1. Two passport-size photographs of the candidate along with two passport-size photographs of his/her father/mother/guardian.
2. All certificates from metric examination onwards must be carried in original along with their photocopies (only for BCA/BBA –I and Postgraduate classes).
3. H.P. Domicile certificate for girl students only.
4. 40% disability certificate and category certificate in case of students seeking any sort of concession/age relaxation.

5. Photocopy of registration card.
6. Original character certificates from Head of the institutional last attended in case of a student seeking admission to the first year of any course.
7. In case if student who has discontinued his/her studies for one or more year, the character certificate must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from gazette class I officer or the Panchayat Pradhan of the village / area concerned.
8. A student seeking admission from board/university other than H.P, will have to produce photocopy of his/ her migration certificate, Affidavit, wherever applicable.

Note: The character certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior the date of admission.

Important:

1. Every student must have his/her own email ID.
2. Every student must mention his/her own bank account number, Aadhaar number, parents' phone number, and his/her own phone number in the admission form.
3. Parents must ensure the entry of their correct phone number in the admission form for receiving important messages through SMS.
4. Photocopy of Bank Account No. and Aadhar No. required.

EXAMINATION & EVALUATION

Students Course Wise Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Evaluation For BBA & BCA

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

(I) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) = 30 Marks

Attendance = 5

Mid-term = 15

Assignment/Quiz/Seminar etc. = 10 marks

(II) Term End Examination (TEE) = 70 Marks.

1. **Classroom Attendance:** Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% lectures/tutorials/practical as a student having less 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination (ESE).

- Provided that those having between 74 and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by Medical Certificate from Government Hospital.
- Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in a prescribed co-curricular activity (e.g. NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemption for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.
- **Classroom Attendance Incentive:**

Those having greater than 75% attendance will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

>75% but < 80% 1 Marks.

>80% but < 85% 2 Marks

>85% but < 90% 3 Marks.

>90% but < 95% 4 Marks.

>95% 5 Marks.

* For those participating in co-curricular activities 25% will be added to percent attendance.

Important: The 7.10(D) of HP University clarifies that only those students shall be allowed to appear in the TTE who has been successful in the CCA. Minimum marks to qualify the CCA are 35%.

ATTENDANCE

1. At least 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the University exam.
2. Irregular students or one who remains absent continuously for 3 days from College any elective subject his/her name will be struck-off from the college rolls. If name of a student is struck-off twice, he/she will not be re-admitted to the college.
3. A student is liable to pay all dues and fines as long as his/her name remains on the college rolls.
4. The Principal reserves the right of expulsion/suspension of any student if the situation warrants so.

LEAVE RULES

1. Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed Proforma should be submitted well in time.
2. Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.

3. The Head of Department is competent to sanction.
4. In case of medical leave for a period of six days or more the applicant must produce a medical certificate.

LIBRARY RULE:

Every student will be issued an Identity Card. Since “I-Card” is the only medium to identify/differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always carry it with him/her and must produce it whenever required (during all working days, examination(s), and college functions(s) etc.) Otherwise he/she will be considered as an outsider and will be punished accordingly.

If the I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such a request. Rs.20/- are to be deposited for a duplicate Identity Card.

Students participating on inter-college competitions should note that the practice/rehearsal timing should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities do not substitute academics/studies.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Students must maintain discipline, dignity, and responsible behaviour on campus and comply with all college rules and instructions.

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING

The College has a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to ragging in any form. Any of the following constitutes ragging and is severely dealt with:

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Punishable Ingredients of Ragging

Abetment to ragging; Criminal conspiracy to rag; Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging; Public nuisance created during ragging; Violation of decency and morals through ragging; Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; Wrongful restraint; Wrongful confinement; Use of criminal force; Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; Extortion; Criminal trespass; Offences against property; Criminal intimidation; Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s); Physical or psychological humiliation; All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging.'

Punishments

At the institution level: Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offense as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
4. Withholding results
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel

7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
10. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
